

Community Relations

Visits to the Schools

Visitors are always welcome and parents are encouraged to visit the schools regularly to meet with the Principal and/or teachers to discuss student progress and growth. In order to insure the safety of children and the maintenance of the proper school atmosphere certain guidelines should be followed:

1. Residents wishing to visit may contact the school Principal directly. Non-residents must make arrangements through the office of the Superintendent.
2. The school Principal should be contacted in advance, so that necessary visitation arrangements can be made.
3. Normally, a school visit will consist of a general tour of the school and a discussion of educational programs.
4. Classroom visitations, when desired, should always be arranged through the Principal. These visitations should be of reasonable duration and should not interfere with any lessons being conducted.
5. All visitors must report to the Principal's office upon arrival at the school.
6. The evaluation of educational programs and professional staff is a highly complex undertaking and requires both training and experience. The views of the public are always welcome but actual evaluation must rest with the Board of Education through their administrative staff.
